Re: Fairspear Road, Leafield – Carriageway Resurfacing

I am writing to inform you that Oxfordshire County Council will be undertaking carriageway maintenance and resurfacing works to Fairspear Road between the speed hump at the edge of Leafield village and the junction with Hill Farm Lane/ Langley Lane.

The works are programmed to start on **Monday 9th February 2026** and are expected to last for up to four weeks, subject to any bad weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances arising during construction.

Works will include drainage improvements, ironwork adjustments and the resurfacing of the existing carriageway surface, following which all existing road markings will be reinstated.

Traffic Management

The works will be carried out under a series of overnight full road closures with working hours from **2000hrs to 0600hrs**. Fairspear Road will be fully reopened outside of the working hours with a fully signed local diversion put in place for the scheme duration. There will be no works carried out during the weekends of 14th Feb, 21st Feb or 28th Feb with Fairspear Road remaining fully open.

- **Mon 9th – Fri 13th Feb:** Verge works & Ironwork adjustment prior to resurfacing.
- **Fri 20th – Thurs 26th Feb:** Full width resurfacing and lining reinstatement.
- **Fri 27th Feb – Wed 4th Mar:** Drainage improvements following resurfacing.

All residents of Fairspear Road in Leafield will have vehicular access throughout via The Green and the village centre. There will be no vehicular access out of Leafield to the north along Fairspear Road during the working hours. Pedestrian access remains unaffected including along the footway and into the Leafield Community Woodland.

A **No Waiting** enforcement comes into operation whilst resurfacing works are undertaken. Please could we kindly request that all vehicles could avoid parking on the carriageway for the duration of the works, as this will impede the resurfacing and could cause delays.

Gatemen / Traffic Marshals will be positioned at both road closure points. They will direct traffic and pedestrians to ensure the safety of the public and workforce during working hours. We ask that you give them your full support and heed their advice whether you are a pedestrian, cyclist, or motorist.

We will endeavour to maintain vehicular access to those properties affected by the works. However, there may be occasions where delays are likely once the new surfacing is laid, as it takes time to cool down and cure, and we apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Keeping You Informed

Several methods of communication are being used to keep you informed of these works:

- Signs are being placed on site to forewarn road users in advance of the works.
